Dec 5: Potential Impact on ITSS

Effective federated ICT structure (unpacked further...)
ITSS contribute to University decision making (cf Manchester)
Ability for the 'University' to set ICT priorities and build ICT plan
Improved 'interconnections'

- Across collegiate University; between units and centre
 - Eg common difficulty of accessing departmental facilities from colleges..
- Helping to ensure consistent ICT provision across units (cf Metrics)

New definition of 'ICT Community'

- We are all part, and have roles; share efforts and work together
- Do we need to be more specific?

'Value-added ICT'

- More interesting and challenging ICT infrastructure; scenarios

V-C's launch of ICT Strategy exercise

Three main points, summarised as follows:

- The University's draft corporate plan includes a firm commitment to developing a coherent ICT strategy by (April) 2006.
- Secondly, there would never be sufficient resources to meet all of the University's aspirations. This underlined the importance of using, to the best possible effect, resources provided for support activities such as ICT.
- Finally, one of the University's great strengths is its federal structure and none of the thinking behind the establishment of the ICT Strategy Steering Group challenges the federal nature of the University. Indeed, conversely, there is scope for a more coherent ICT strategy and set of policies to underpin the enhanced fulfillment of individual aspirations.

- Fostering innovation, best practice, and value for money in the use of ICT in teaching, learning, and research across the University


How is the Programme being run?

PWJ Take -- 1

- Devolved ICT structure for Oxford absolutely vital
 - Local support, coherent infrastructure
 - Collective responsibility to deliver services to the user
- 2. University must recognise consequences
 - More complex than centralised system
 - Needs to be operated effectively
 - Teamwork vital
- 3. The 'Centre' is there to support, and provide services for, local units
 - Consistent approach to enterprise systems (OUCS, BSP, OULS)
 - Enable local applications to work effectively
 - Enable local investment to be cost-effective
 - Must be ability for collegiate University:
 - to set priorities in central expenditure
 - to ensure central services meet their needs
 - Onus on units to use satisfactory central services





Section 3 – Oxford ICT Structure

Tune Oxford's devolved ICT structure, create ICT Forum for IT Staff

 Refine the devolved Oxford ICT structure through application of a 3-layer model comprising local services, standards-based shared services, and enterprise-wide services.

Three layer model:-

Local Services

- totally at discretion of local unit

Standards-based Shared Services

available for opt-in or opt-out

Enterprise-wide Services

- standard for everyone

- Create an ICT Forum in which all ICT staff within Oxford are represented, coordinated by the IT Support Staff Group, and allocated a sufficient budget in order to develop a secondment scheme and fund other relevant activities.

 - Illustrative amounts at present
 - Principles important







Section 5 – ICT Budget and Priority Plan

Prepare 5 year ICT central expenditure roadmap

- Demonstration of process: numbers and valuations illustrative
- Collect proposed central ICT expenditure, assign priorities based on feedback
 Future tool for Oxford to set ICT priorities
- Central ICT annual expenditure > £20m, cf total ICT estimated to be c. £50m

PWJ Take -- 3

- 1. Some tricky decisions ahead
- 2. Need to ensure that mission-critical services are adequately resourced
- 3. University facing difficult financial future
- 4. Set of challenges:-
 - Adequate funding for essential services
 - Cohesive cohort of ICT staff (see Pete's presentation)
 - Appropriate 'glue' for devolved ICT structure
 - Identity management
 - Shared filespace
 - Wireless
 - •
 - Correct allocation of applications to layers
 - Interoperability crucially important
- 5. Necessary for Oxford to have new structure to meet these needs
 - NB means structures through each Division, Colleges, Central Admin...
- 6. Information Strategy required...






Section 6 – Structure for CDM

Prepare new ICT Governance Structure...

- Create a CDM structure setting policy, providing strategic direction, meeting objectives, identifying/managing risks, complying with legislation and ensuring optimal ICT operational delivery.
- Form other groups within the structure, as needed, to report to the PRAC ICT subcommittee and GPC, and terminate groups on project completion or completion of activity.
- Create Architecture Group
 - Interoperability
- Set up a User Forum ...
- Establish an ICT Director post
 - Make it work



Status and Future

Many Strawman documents created

Three Draft ICT Strategic Plans created

- Third published on 19 June
- Together with 'Summary and Recommendations' document

Submitted to PRAC - for consideration on 26 June

- Hope that agreement will be given for formal consultation period
- May go through Council on 11 July

Consultation period through MT 2006

- Another opportunity for input from ITSS
- Another round of presentations...

Assuming reasonable degree of support, final *ICT Strategic Plan* document prepared

Submit to Council for final consideration

Subject to modifications required, start implementation





Impact on ITSS

- New holistic approach to ICT, and its coordination
- New focus on centre providing services appropriate for local units/users
 - Consistent approach to enterprise systems (OUCS, BSP, OULS)
 - Authority of local units unaffected (of course)
- New focus on interoperability
 - Architecture group, agreed standards, identity management,...
 - Information Strategy needed (as at Open Meeting)
- ICT Forum
 - Fast-track connections
 - Professional body for ITSS
- New way collegiate University set central ICT expenditure priorities
 - And ensuring mission-critical services adequately funded
- New ICT Governance structure
 - PRAC ICT S/c single point of convergence
 - With increased contribution from/connection with ITSS
