# Product Lineup - Versions

- Vista Business
- Vista Enterprise
  - more security and hardware encryption
  - UNIX subsystem for UNIX apps (SUA)
- Vista Home Basic
  - Doesn't include Aero
  - Less searching
  - No DVD burning
  - No Tablet Support
- Vista Home Premium
- Vista Ultimate
  - Has everything in all the others
  - “Top of the range”
- All available in 32- or 64-bit editions

# System Requirements

## □ Basic

- Modern 800MHz processor
- 512MB RAM
- DirectX 9 Graphics

## □ “Premium ready”

- 1 GHz x86 or x64 processor
- 1GB RAM
- DirectX 9, WDDM, 128 MB graphics RAM, Pixel Shader 2.0, 32 bits per pixel
- DVD-ROM
- Audio
- Internet Access





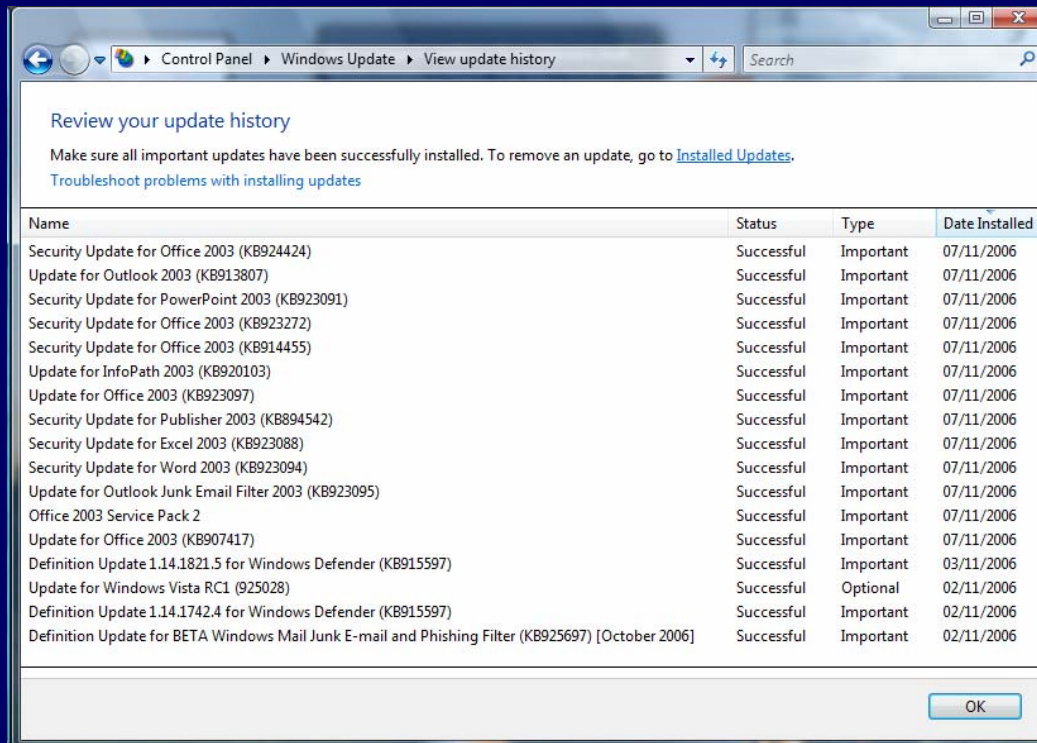
# Installation

- <http://www.microsoft.com/windowsvista/>
- Using Business Edition
  - Download ISO from <https://downloads.oucs.ox.ac.uk/itss/>
  - Burn DVD from Microsoft ISO file
    - (note only business edition is bootable)
- Dell Laptop
  - I used Celeron 2.2GHz, 1GB RAM
  - Used Intel Display Driver for XP from Dell
- Email [its3@oucs.ox.ac.uk](mailto:its3@oucs.ox.ac.uk) with IP and software card number for activation
- Note Startup Repair Tool



# Windows Update

- ❑ Many updates already available
- ❑ Now part of Control Panel





# User Account Control

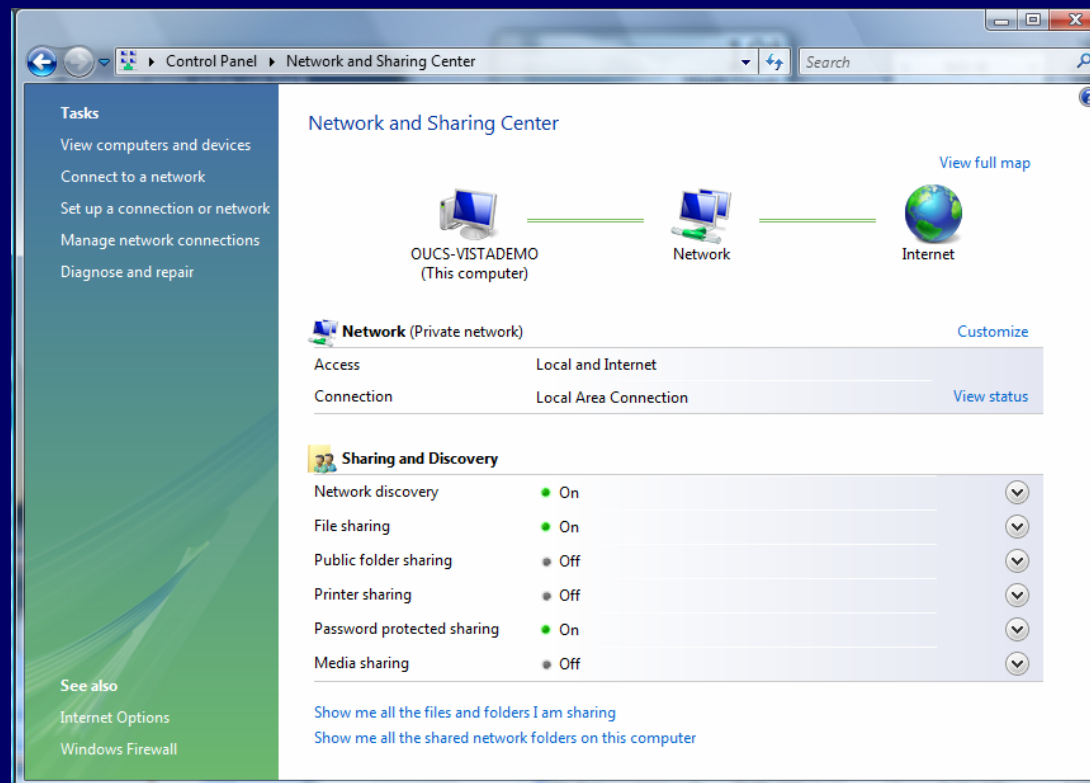
- Provides some security when making system changes
  - Eg installing/uninstalling software
- Being an administrator is not the same as being THE administrator
- Beware – Administrator Password not set on initial install
  - But account also not enabled





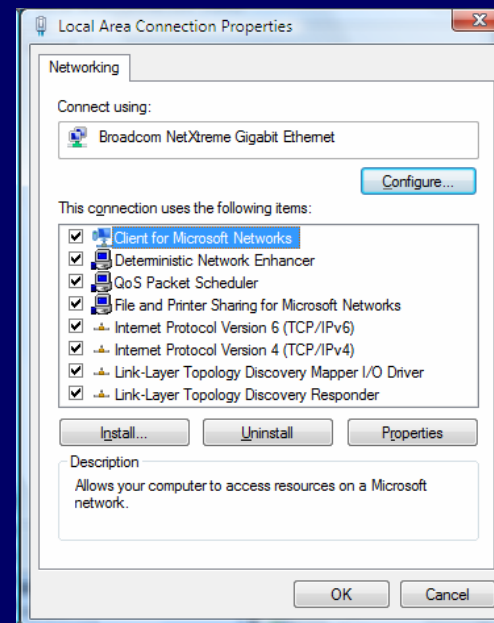
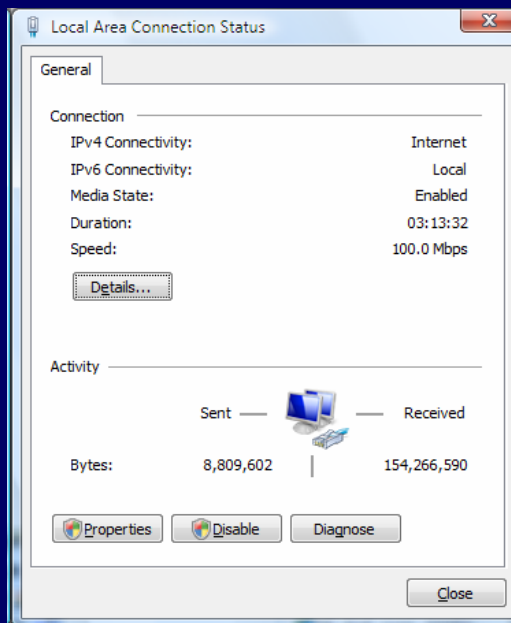

- From network and sharing center
  - Choose “manage network connections”
  - Right-click items for properties



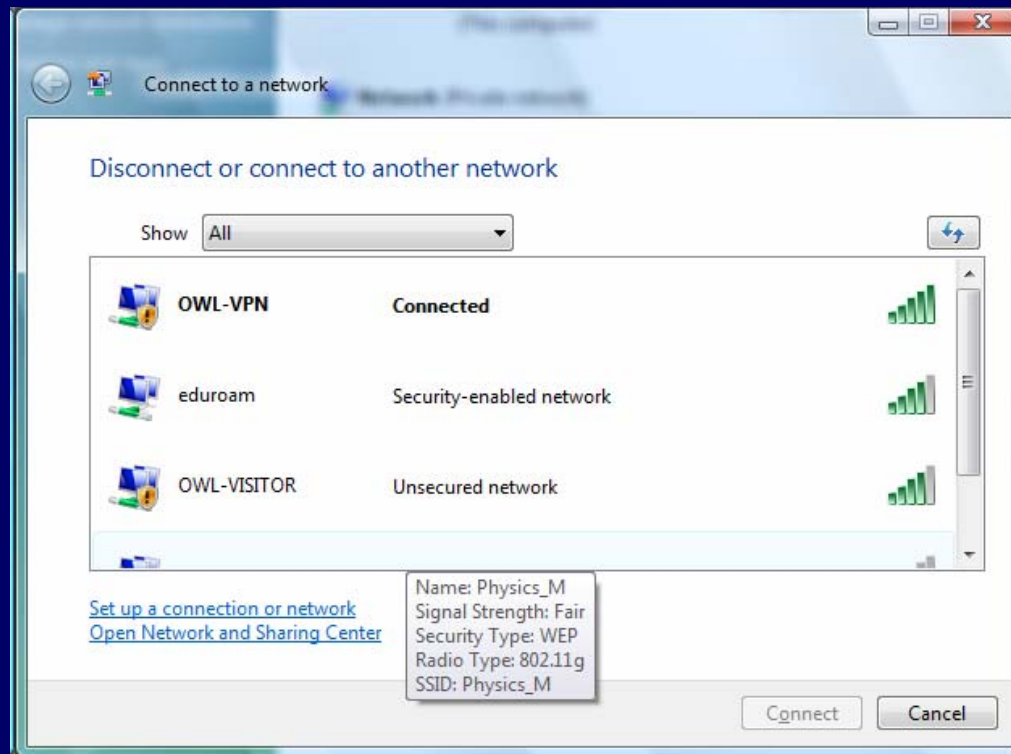
# Wireless Networking

□ Also from network and sharing center



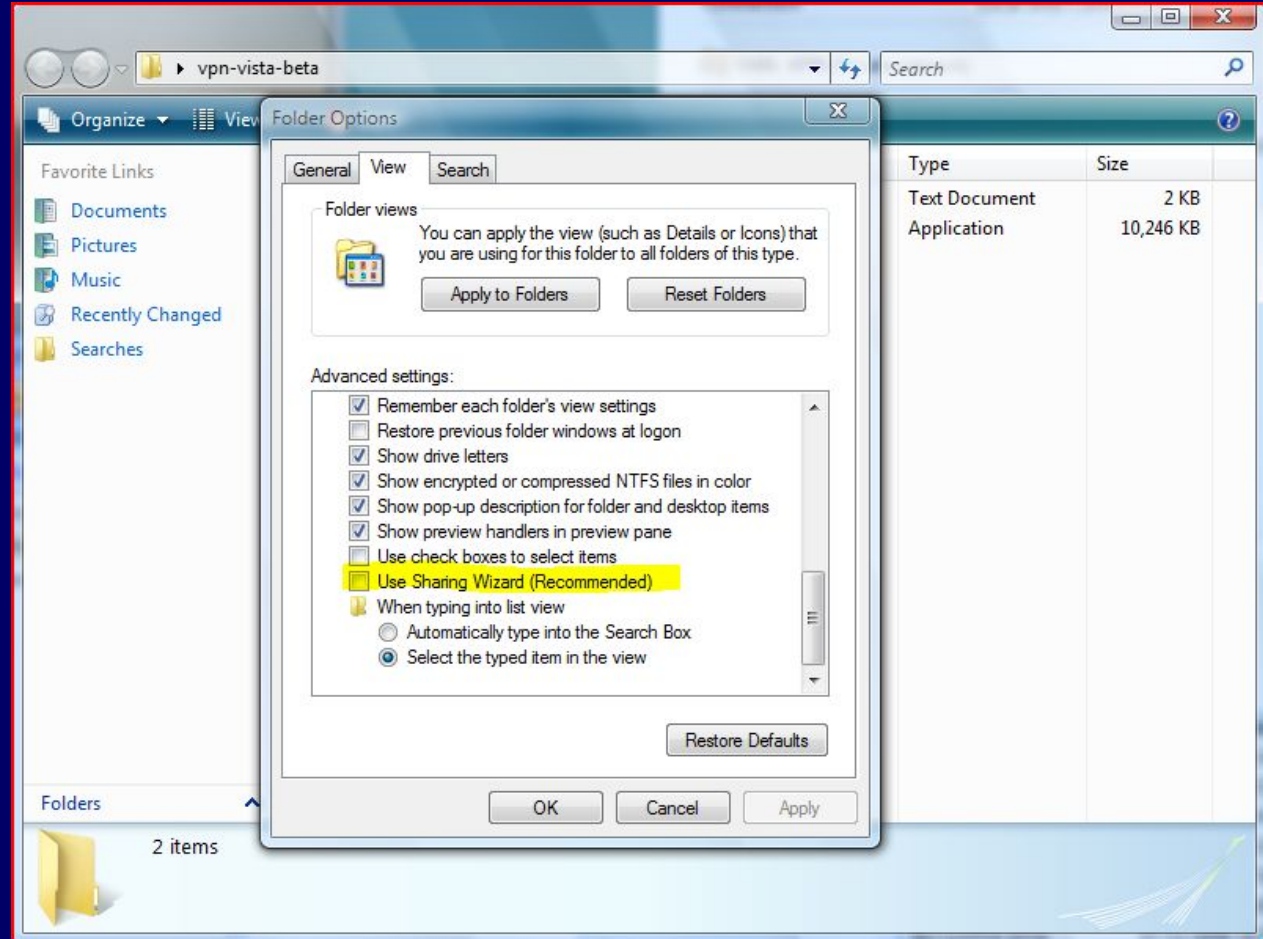
# Wireless Networking

- How to connect:
- Vista has drivers for USB and PCMCIA Adapters from OUCS shop



# File Sharing

- Similar to XP Pro
- Changed “Use simple file sharing”





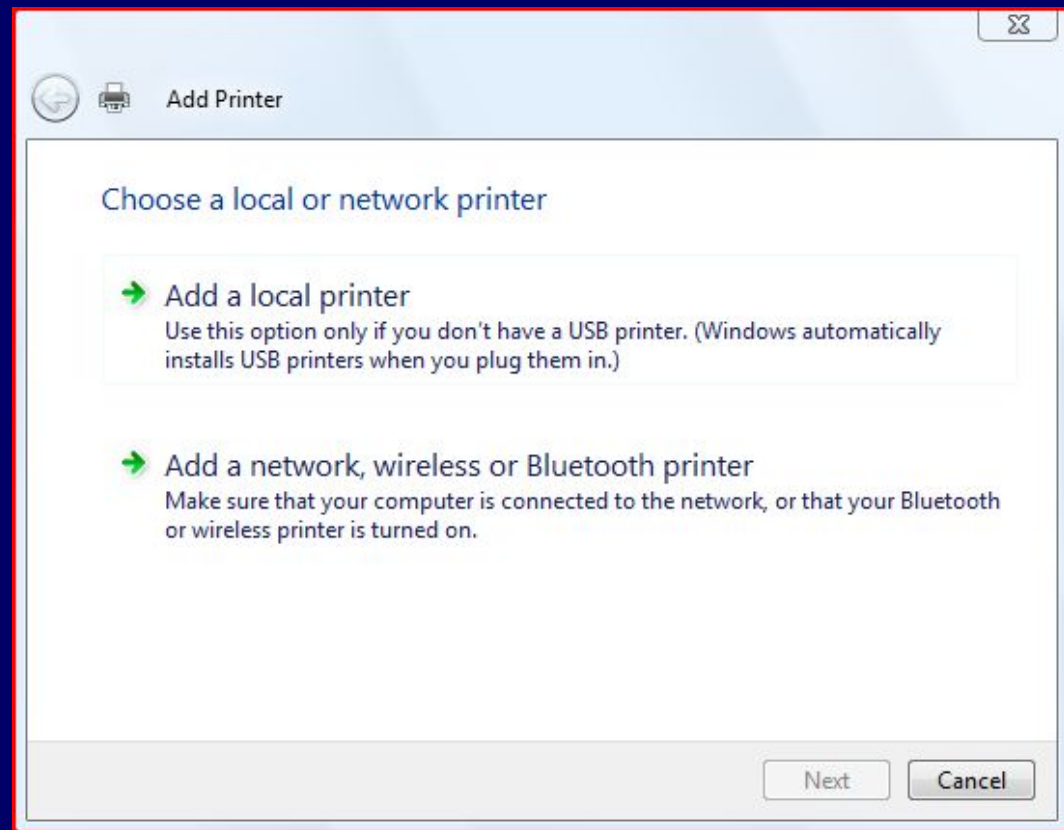
# VPN

- ❑ Latest version is 5.0.00 for Vista and below (not 98).
- ❑ Distributed pre-configured packages at:
  - <https://register.oucs.ox.ac.uk/oxonly/downloads/vpn/windows/latest-untested/>
- ❑ Not Beta any more and appears to be stable
- ❑ Earlier versions do not work with Vista
- ❑ Required for OWL
- ❑ Often needed for external access to network resources by students/staff



# Printing

- Via Control Panel, Hardware and Sound







# Printing

- But of course we treat TCP/IP printers using LPR as local printers, just like in XP
- Vista has lots of drivers built-in
- HP Universal Printing Driver appears not to work at the moment
  - Crashes Explorer
- Standard HP drivers seem OK
  - Not HP Printing System though







# Software

- IE7 comes as standard
  - Note no support from Oracle yet
- Firefox 2.0 appears to be OK
- TSM backup is supported
  - Need client 5.4.02
    - Only for XP/Vista/2003 NOT 2000
  - Only for use on 10MB+ network connections
  - NOT Broadband/VPN or Dialup.
- Only some AV products currently available for Vista
  - <http://www.microsoft.com/uk/athome/security/update/windowsvistaav.msp>
- Microsoft is offering Windows Live OneCare
  - There are others including F-Secure and AVG
- iTunes 7.2 works OK
- Note MS update for corrupt on eject problem

# Sophos

- Will provide support for Vista with Sophos Anti-Virus v 6.5.
- When released, Sophos Anti-Virus for Windows 2000/XP/2003/Vista, version 6.5, will be updated automatically from the current version 6.0.x. No action needed.
- Support for Vista planned in the next major versions of Enterprise Console, Sophos Control Center and Sophos Client Firewall.
- No support for Vista in the current versions of Enterprise Console, Sophos Control Center and Sophos Client Firewall on Vista.
- Sophos 6.5 has had issues with Vista and it has not been tested enough to release in Oxford.
  - Helpdesk is recommending AVG 7.5 for personal use
- Version available for ITSS at <https://downloads.oucs.ox.ac.uk/itss/ictst/sophos/>
- Sophos hope to announce SAV version 7 next week so problem with version 6 may not be fixed quickly

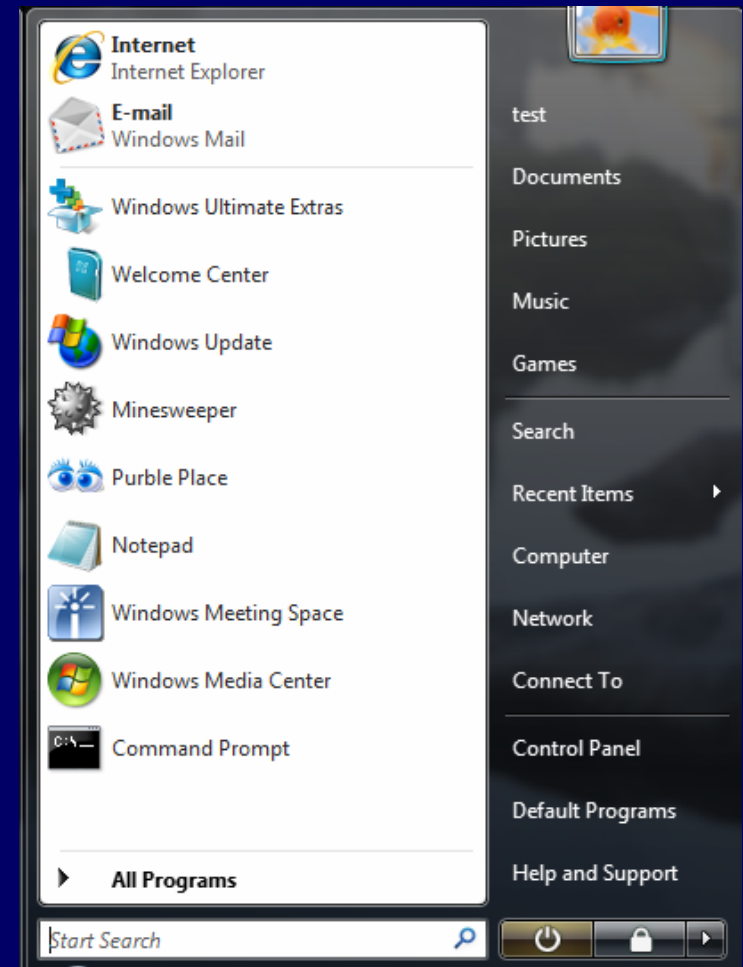

# Major Changes

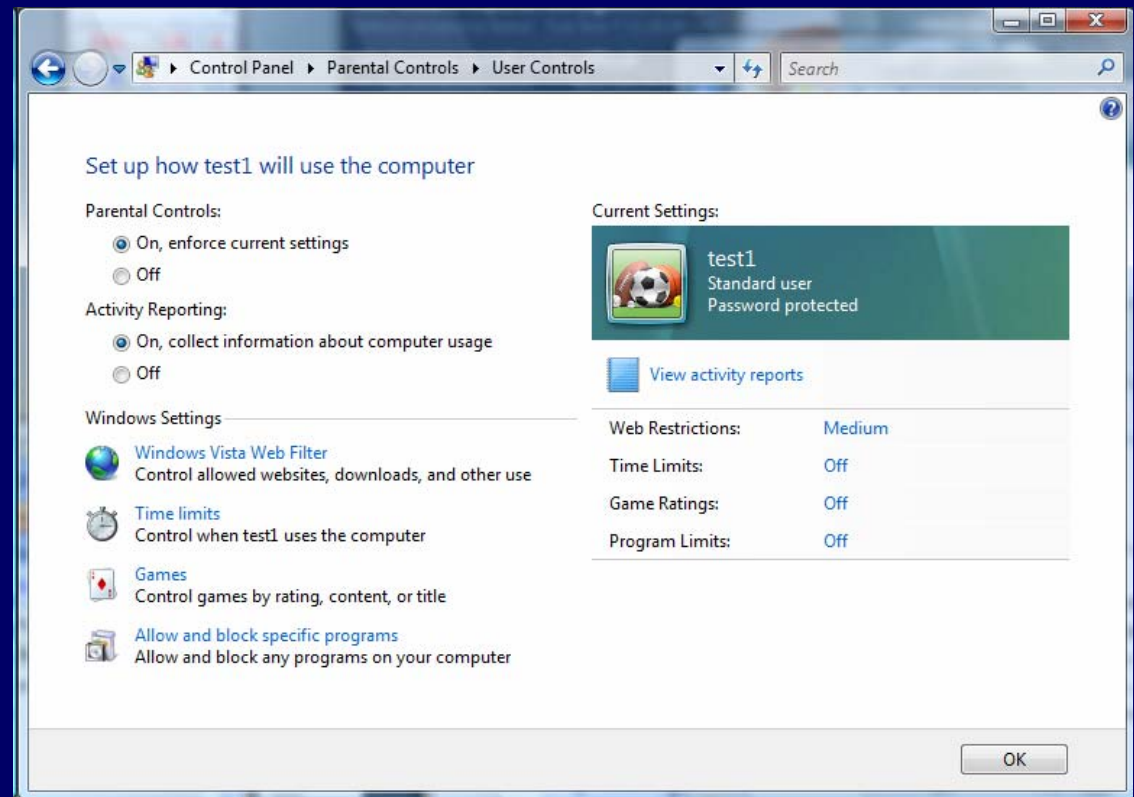
## □ Taskbar /Start Menu

- No huge changes but look and feel a bit different
- Similar customisations
- Adds window previews
- “Run...” has moved into “accessories”



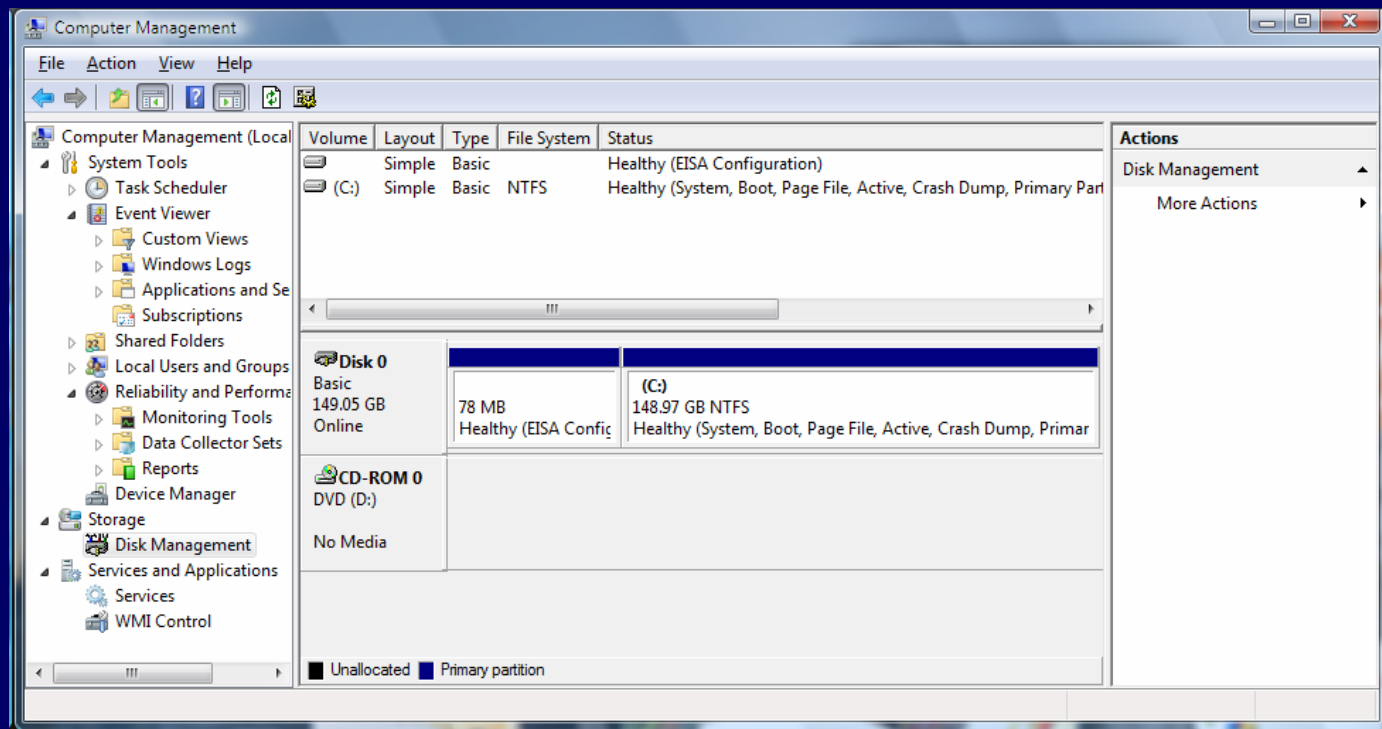
# Parental Controls

- Control of
  - Websites
  - Use times
  - Game ratings
  - Specific Programs
  - Not in business editions



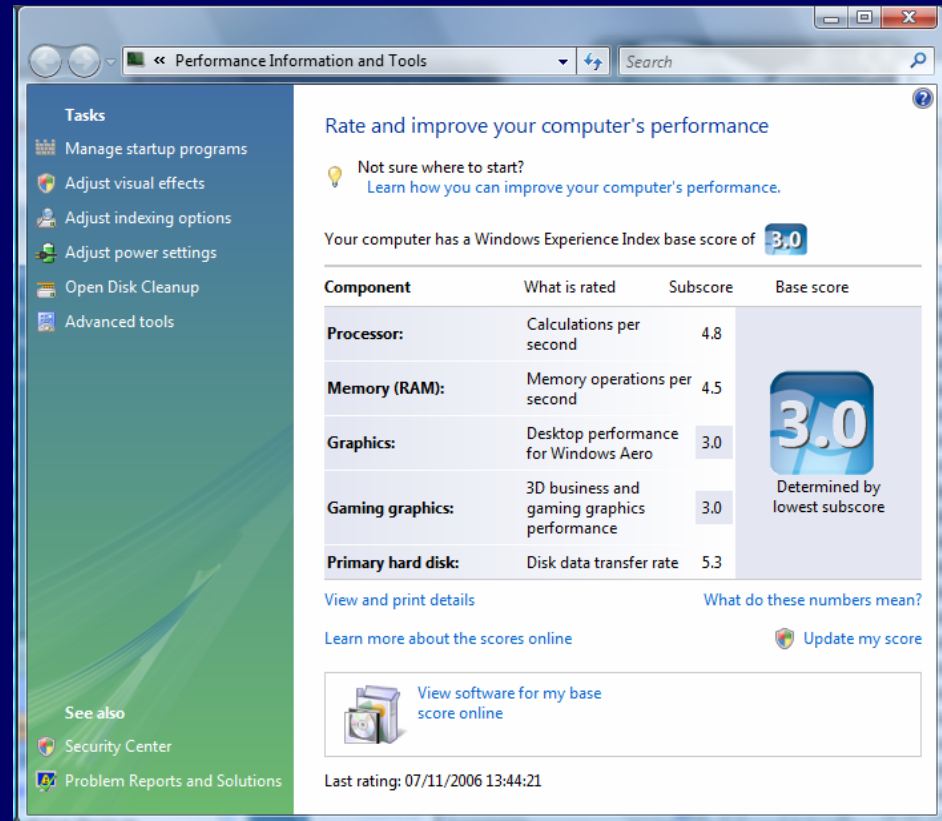
# Computer Management

- Much richer tools
  - Especially disk management and event viewer



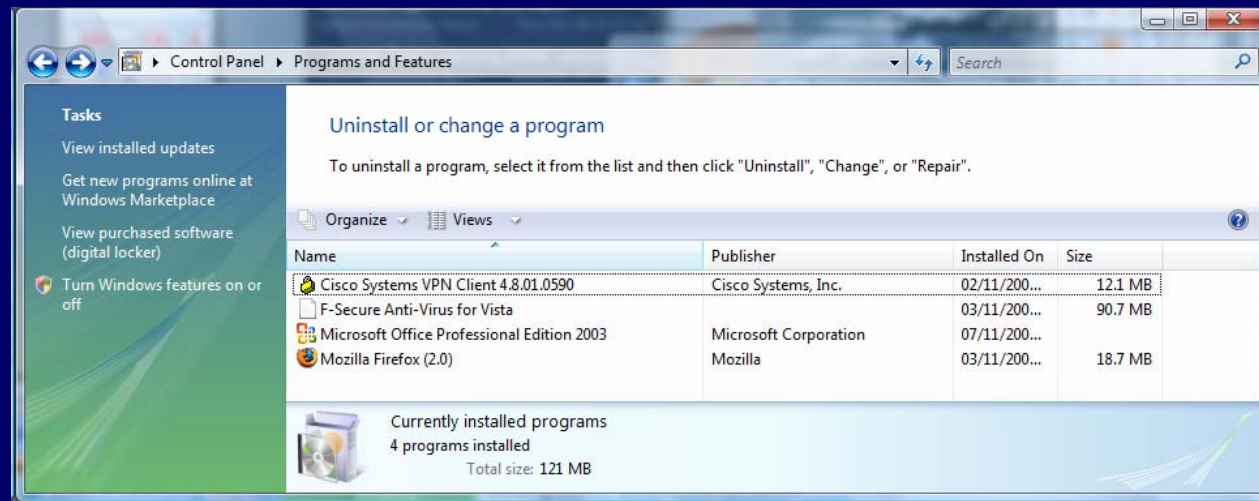
# Windows Aero

- ❑ 3D effects
- ❑ Transparent Windows
- ❑ Easy Windows key + Tab app switching
- ❑ Requires a reasonable spec machine
- ❑ Spec measured by Windows Experience Index
- ❑ Laptop not powerful enough ☹



# Programs and Features

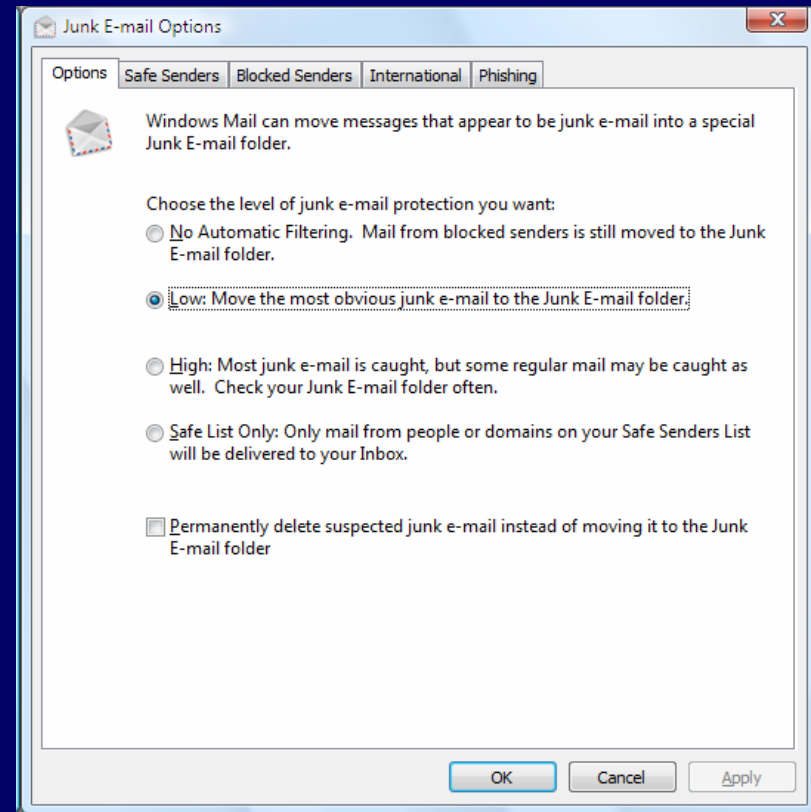
- ❑ Replaces “Add/Remove Programs”
- ❑ Allows viewing of updates
- ❑ Access to digital locker and Marketplace
- ❑ Control Windows “features”





# Windows Mail

- ❑ Direct descendant of Outlook Express 6
- ❑ Reads NNTP news
- ❑ Good junk mail features
- ❑ Protects from Phishing
- ❑ Windows Calendar





# “Default Programs”

- Allows modifications to:
  - File associations, Autoplay, Default Programs





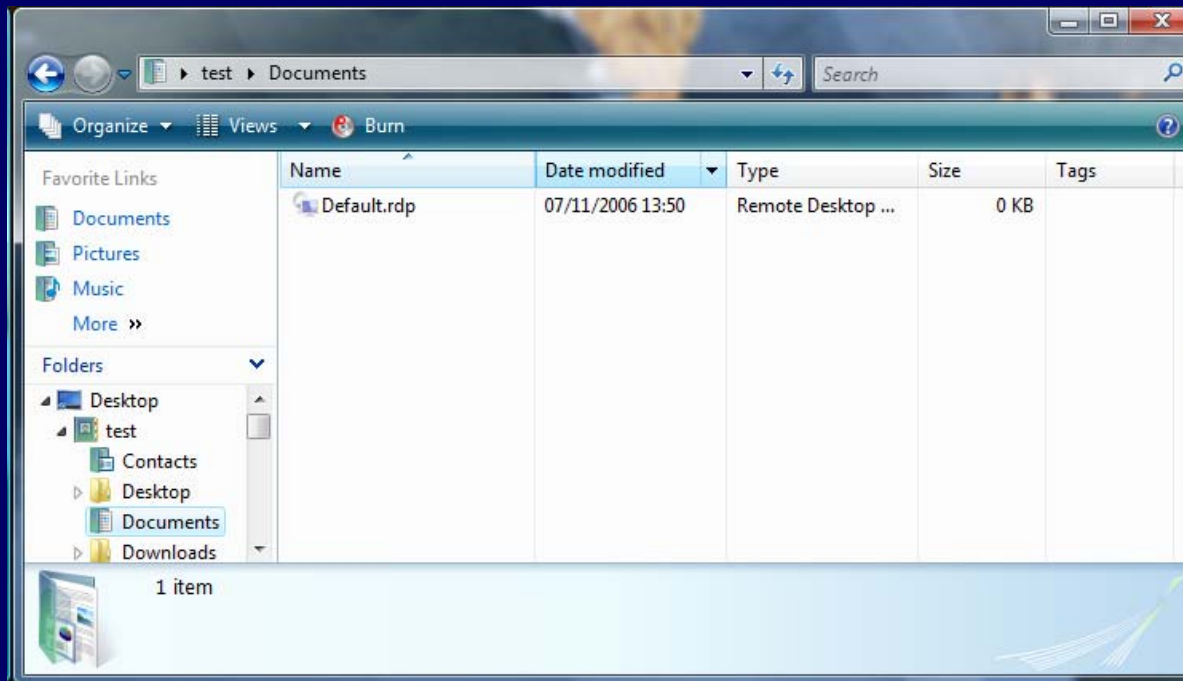
# Windows Sidebar

- ❑ This is similar to Mac OS X Dashboard
- ❑ Gadgets rather than Widgets
- ❑ Good for watching RSS feeds
- ❑ Many widgets available



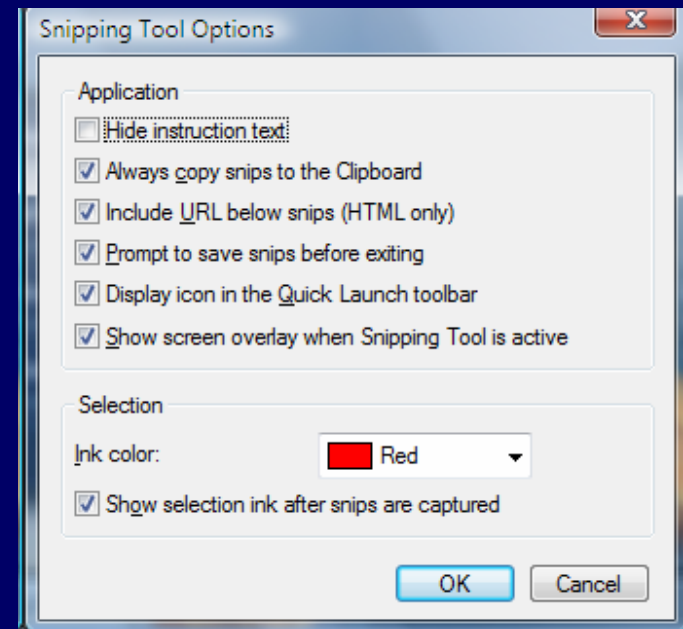
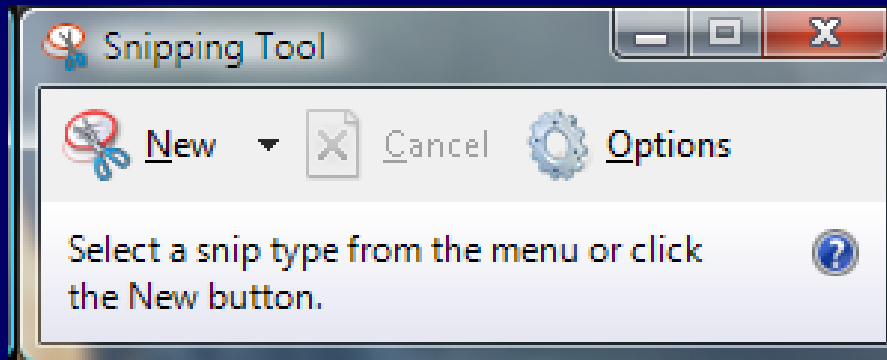
# Windows Explorer

- Looks more like OS X
- File overwrite now offers to rename



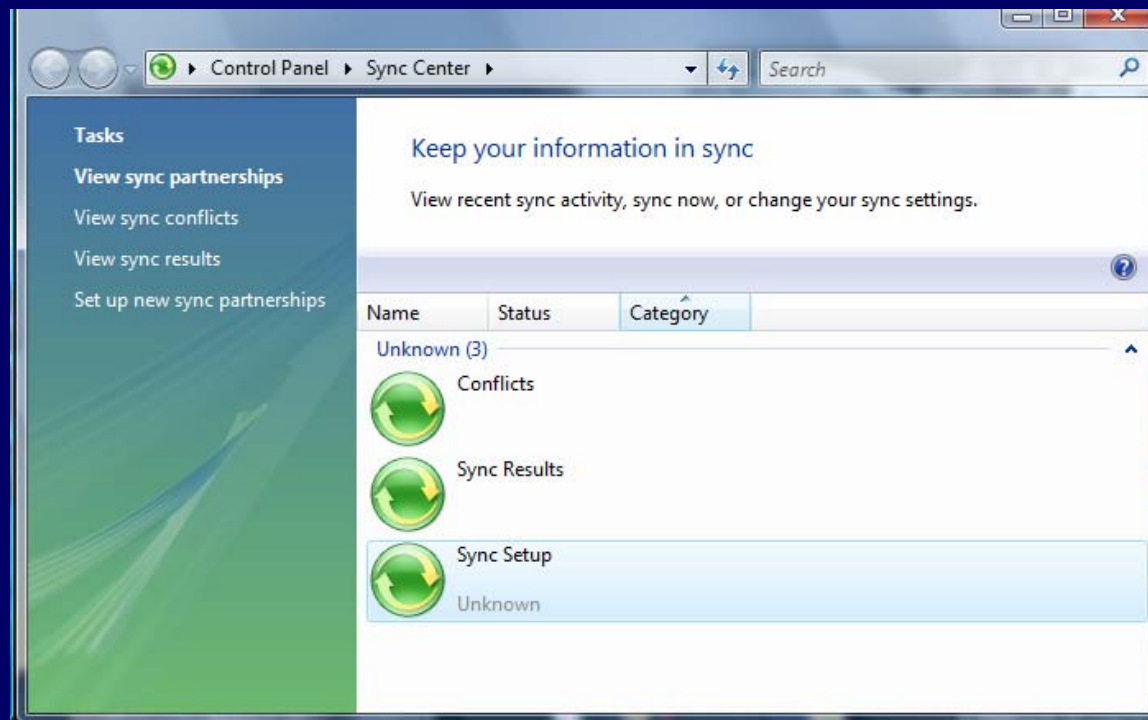
# Snipping Tool

- ❑ Alt-PrintScreen on Acid!
- ❑ Allows Screen, Window, Rectangle or Freeform image-grabbing

# Licensing and Activation

- Volume Licence Keys with XP meant that volume-licence products didn't require activation
  - Keys often got into the wrong hands
  - They would work on as many machines as you liked
  - Huge potential for piracy
  - Difficult for Microsoft to disable keys without innocent victims!
- Vista changes this so all products now need activation
- Two methods of activation:
  - Key Management Server (KMS)
  - Multiple Activation Key (MAK)





# OEM Licence Activation

- ❑ Straightforward for home users
- ❑ More tricky for volume licences
- ❑ If the vendor is pre-installing images there will need to be coordination to make sure the custom-built machines will work with either KMS or MAK
- ❑ Vendors may just supply OEM versions with activation keys





# KMS Activation

- KMS runs on a server (one for Oxford is ok) and provides activation “leases”
  - Need  $\geq 25$  machines for it to work
  - Activation renewed every 7 days (configurable)
    - Invisible to user if it succeeds
  - Activation becomes invalid if not renewed in 180 days
  - Machines without valid activation go into reduced functionality mode
    - Constant warnings ensue
    - Windows update will deny access
    - Machine practically unusable
  - Fine for machines that are based in Oxford
  - Advantage that no keys have to be issued
  - Not good for machines in use out in the field







# MAK Activation

- ❑ MAK keys will activate a pre-determined number of machines in a similar way to current XP keys
- ❑ Can be done independently or via a MAK proxy if machines don't have internet access
- ❑ MAK keys can also be used over the phone for non-connected machines





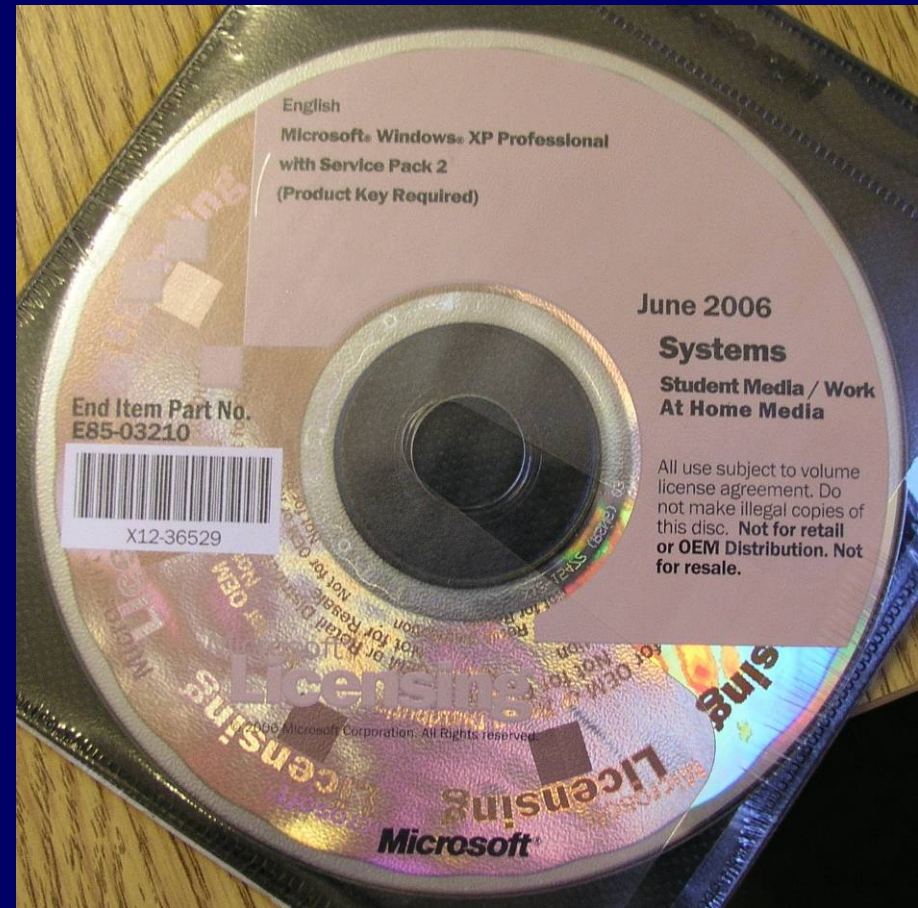
# What is OUCS doing?

- ❑ KMS set up as a pilot for ITSS use
- ❑ Firewallled to control access
- ❑ Currently around 150 registered nodes
  - Some have registered ranges for non-student machines
- ❑ ITSS request access via [its3@oucs.ox.ac.uk](mailto:its3@oucs.ox.ac.uk)
  - Software card number and IP address required
- ❑ ISOs available to ITSS from <https://downloads.oucs.ox.ac.uk/itss>
- ❑ Wiki page with lots of info at [https://wiki.oucs.ox.ac.uk/itss/Windows\\_Vista](https://wiki.oucs.ox.ac.uk/itss/Windows_Vista)
  - Includes how to activate product
- ❑ We will not be issuing MAK keys yet
  - Waiting for more tools from Microsoft
- ❑ EZMLM list vista-activation for further announcements
  - Currently 153 members



# What about home use?

- Home use still possible but version is different
  - Must be purchased from OUCS shop in normal way (£20)
  - Will have different (individual) keys to the volume products
  - NOT for students
- Volume licence products must NOT be installed on personal machines
- Not needed for machine supplied with Vista





# My recommendation

- ❑ Think carefully before you install Vista in production environments
  - Check whether all the packages you use will work with it
  - New machines may come with Vista anyway
- ❑ By all means install it on a spare machine for testing and learning so you are ready to support people who come with personal machines with vista installed
