MIT KDC only global source for authentication (not used globally!)











Podcasting in Oxford: Future

- Podcast Producer used as media conversion engine
- Integrates well into existing infrastructure
- Multiformat support crucial e.g Episode Podcast
- OpenAFS file system now extended with podcasting "space"
 - Uses MIT KDC for authentication
 - Designed for delivery formats
 - Need for future archival space








