




Reader Access Areas – Perspective View of Proposed General Enquiries













What's the score at the Bodleian?

Help us to describe the Libraries' digitised music collections

The principal aim of the project is to investigate a cost-effective approach to increasing access to music scores from the Bodleian's collections, to be achieved by a combination of rapid digitization and the creation of descriptive metadata through crowdsourcing. A recent pilot study concluded that traditional retrospective cataloguing of the music collections would require extensive funding and would take many years to achieve, and it is intended that the methodology and outcomes of this project should be used to inform a more economical approach to creating access to other material in the Bodleian.

The approach will be two-fold: firstly to undertake all procedures associated with the online delivery of digital surrogates for a proposed selection of material (to include basic descriptive metadata, conservation, tracking, delivery platform and preservation); and secondly to create an environment which allows for, and encourages, the enhancement of the basic metadata through crowd-sourcing and additional features such as Music OCR and online performances.



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A sequence of unbound and uncatalogued music scores will form the main body of material selected for the initial phase of the project, comprising 64 boxes of piano music, mostly sheet music from the period 1860-1880 which includes dance music and other pieces designed for home entertainment, many with illustrated covers. The value of this material is explored in the Research Context page.

So as to provide some evidence of the different approaches required for different material that future phases of the project might encounter, a small number of bound volumes representing different types of musical score are also being included.

It is anticipated that the scores will begin to be made available online from late spring 2011, and that the facility for crowdsourcing will be provided later in the summer; in the meantime, you can follow progress on the Project Blog.

The project is being funded by Google and overseen by a number

of Project Participants.

Hidden Pages

Yesterday I foolishly uploaded a <u>Pages</u> document to my work machine (that isn't a Mac) before heading into the office. I needed the content because I was due to give it to Susan that morning. Luckily I stumbled upon <u>this tip</u> and thought I'd share it in case you ever find yourself faced with a Mac disk full of documents and no Mac to read them on...

I guess I shouldn't have been surprised to discover a Pages document is in fact a zip file (like Word docs) and if you unpack it not only do you find an XML representation of the document (which would let you get at the text - run it through <u>tidy</u> first though as there aren't any line breaks!) or, neater, in the <u>QuickLook</u> directory is a PDF (file reports PDF 1.3) of the document.

Day saved! Phew!

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
