Programme Objectives

- Adopt the next release of Oracle Financials (R12)
- All key modules configured, tested and implemented
- All system integration components in place and working (BizTalk)
- A high-performing infrastructure available in Oxford
- Users fully briefed and trained
- All process and policy changes introduced in line with system changes
- Data migrated successfully
- Fully functioning Support Centre well before go-live

Scale of change

- Increase in user base to c.3,500.
- Marketplace to be hosted on Oracle iProcurement.
- All users must have a record on CoreHR to access Oracle Financials.
- All current users will need to complete the necessary training before accessing the new system.
- All suppliers, customers and employee records will be cleansed and updated before go-live.
- All suppliers will be able to access a self-service web portal to check the status of their requisitions.

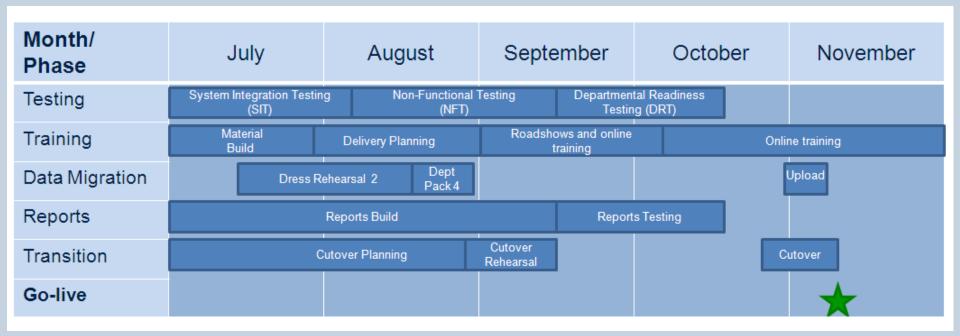

Remaining Project phases



Non-functional testing will take place in an NFT environment to test single incidents. NFT will involve a full Disaster Recovery test, Operations Acceptance Testing, penetration, load and performance testing.

Departmental user testing

- System Integration Testing: Underway now
 - Testing all functionality, available reports and interfaces in a controlled environment.
 - 80 departmental users to take part.
- Departmental Readiness Testing: 23 Sept–18 Oct
 - Departmental users running a series of test scripts for key departmental processes such as raising a requisition.
 - Limited to 300 users; review of departmental set up.
 - Not a validation of the system design and configuration.

Following the test session, attendees will also be asked to test a couple of the scripts and reports on their local PC to test the local departmental infrastructure.

This would allow testing of, e.g. email report distributions, local printing, local access, internet links, etc.



Technical changes impacting IT Officers

- New reporting solution (EiS)
 - No desktop ADI install required for R12
 - Still required to access legacy system which will be read-only
- Current reporting distribution and printing macros replaced by EiS functionality in R12
- R12 tax engine removes need for departmental VAT coding
- No Oracle Inventory Module
 - Local inventory solutions to be developed by 31 July 2013
- Any local departmental tools extracting Oracle information may need redesigning





Impact on IT Officers as System Users

- Shopping via iProcurement not Marketplace
- All shoppers will need an Oracle login and will need to attend an iProcurement Roadshow briefing
- All users will need Oracle training
- For a typical user this will consist of Roadshows and online training
- Greater development of punchouts, e.g. Dell
- Greater use of Projects e.g. for tracking IT project expenditure

- Browsers
 - IE (7/8/9 not 10)
 - Firefox ESR
 - Safari (Mac only)
- Java 6 only
 - 7 to be reviewed across all systems (OSS, CORE HR, etc.)
 - Java 6 updates not generally available
 - Access for ITSS via downloads.oucs site
 - Including "silent non-updating" packages (See recent itss-discuss emails)
- MS Office for WebADI 2007, 2010
- Support Matrix will change in next 3 months
 - IE10, Firefox ESR 24.x [c. Sept], Mountain Lion, Mavericks [Q3/Q4], JRE7, Office 2013

All users who currently have transactional access to Oracle Financials, iProcurement or Marketplace are required to complete training before accessing R12.

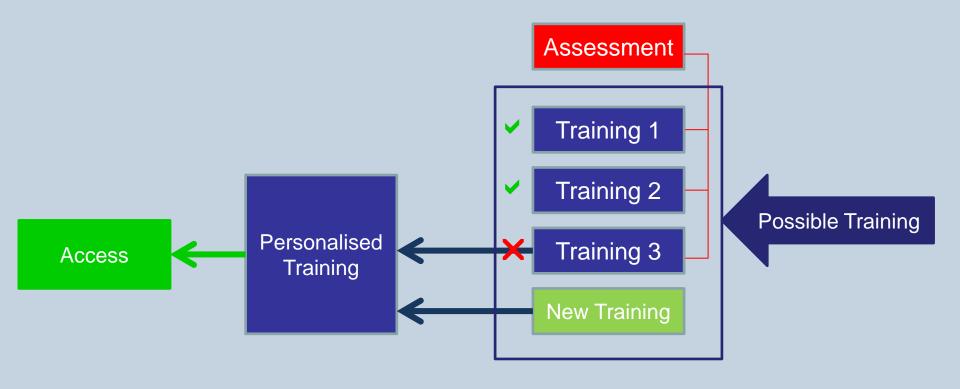
- Some iProcurement module briefings will be closed sessions for specific divisions/departments.

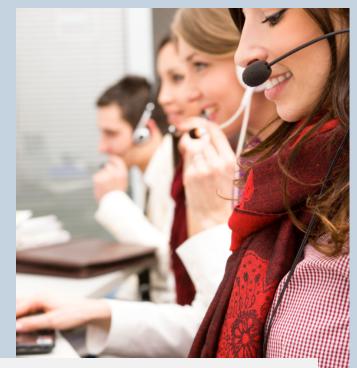
