Courses

ITILv3 whistle-stop tour was a presented by Tony Brett to a diverse group of curious and interested IT staff. ITIL is a structured process to focus on IT service provision with the aim of continually improving services. Tony managed to give a good taste of a very dry subject, feedback was collated using Weblearn surveys and generally the feeling was ITIL knowledge was clarified or reinforced for attendees and some staff were encouraged to pursue this pathway.

ITIL v3 Foundation, is a 3 day course and examination that is an increasingly recognised and desired qualification in industry and IT. This was delivered at OUCS. Look out for courses on other subjects through the ITSS index.

We ran the usual New ITSS Induction in September with 14 attendees. .

For a Free digital Society, an entertaining and thought provoking talk by Richard Stallman of the free software foundation society, was heavily subscribed from within and without the Oxford IT community.

Inaugural High Performance Computing, Special Interest Group, HPC SIG event was held at the oxford e-research centre. A full report is available in the ICTF newsletter.

The ITSS Christmas dinner was held in the McKenna room at Christ Church after drinks in the buttery bar. This event continues to grow and had record attendance this year at over 40 people. The venue may have to be reviewed if it continues to grow. I think this was largely due to the decision by ICTF steering group to subsidise places for ITSS so that those places cost only £20 rather than the £35 true cost. Christ Church did us proud in quality of food and ambiance. It was good to see lots of ITSS taking partners along to this event.

Learn and Lunch workshops of interest included a Lan3 collaboration with Palo Alto, demonstrating next generation firewall technology with an emphasis on innovative malware detection.

Cisco Lunch and Learn was well attended at OUCS, these events are a great opportunity to ask highly technical questions face to face, as well as improve our horizon scanning abilities, and build relationships.

An IT managers meeting was organised to allow Michael Sibley, deputy registrar to present the ICCP plans. Currently the focus is on appointing a CIO who will then lead the coordination of OUCS, BSP and UAS services. Paul Jeffreys, Director of IT at OUCS presented the Information Security developments and further funding phases. Ben Bridle also spoke to announce ICTF is gathering Information to highlight the work of ITSS in the wider University, with the expectation to feed this to the ICCP workgroups.

The IT Suppliers' Exhibition was a great success once again and our thanks go to Mondale for arranging a good line-up of exhibitors in these difficult times, and to all of you for attending in good numbers and nice and early. We need to advertise the breakout sessions more clearly and there is room for improvement here.
